**Ray Allen Billington Prize**

**University of New Mexico (UNM)**

**Deadline:** July 31, 2003

**Amount:** Unknown

**Abstract:** In recognition of the late Ray Allen Billington's leadership in the field of Western history, and of his services as the first president of the Western History Association, the Ray Allen Billington Prize was established to recognize the best article (essay of 10,000 words or less) on Western history published in any journal other than the *Western Historical Quarterly*. The purpose of the award is to encourage authors and editors alike to seek excellence in the field of Western history.

To be eligible, an article must deal with a topic relating to the North American West, including Mexico, Canada, and Alaska. Articles will be judged according to (1) the significance of each as a contribution to knowledge; (2) the skill and imaginativeness with which the author has done research in original materials or has reinterpreted some well-known question; and (3) the literary quality of the essay.

**Gutenberg-e Prizes****American Historical Association (AHA)****Deadline:** September 01, 2003**Amount:** \$20,000

**Abstract:** The American Historical Association's (AHA's) Gutenberg-e is a prize competition aimed at encouraging the electronic publication of the best history dissertations. For the 2003 competition, nominations are being accepted for dissertations or first-book manuscripts in the fields of women's history or the history of gender. The program is not intended simply to reward excellence in scholarship with yet another prestigious prize, but rather to use prestige to set a high standard for electronic publishing. By legitimizing electronic publishing, the AHA hopes to change the attitudes of academics toward e-books. By making the most of the new media, the program may also contribute to a new conception of the book itself as a vehicle of knowledge.
