NSBE/SHPE/SWE Members (NSS) Scholarship

Over the years many members of the NSBE, SHPE and SWE organizations have made successful contributions to the Morgan Stanley Information Technology organization. In recognition of this, we have developed an academic scholarship program exclusive to NSBE, SHPE and SWE student members. The scholarship consists of a \$5,000 - \$10,000 academic scholarship and paid summer internship in Morgan Stanley's Information Technology Division.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

- > All recipients are awarded an academic scholarship and a paid technology internship.
- > Recipients applying during their junior year, or fourth year in a 5-year program, are awarded \$10,000 during their senior year, or fifth year, to cover any unmet educational needs.
- > Recipients applying during their sophomore year, or in their third year in a 5-year program, are awarded \$5,000 during their junior year, or fourth year, to cover any unmet educational needs.
- > Scholarships are renewed for the senior year in an amount of \$5,000 at the Firm's discretion.

Eligibility

- > Have an active, consecutive enrollment as a full-time student as defined by his/her college during each semester of scholarship award
- > Be a sophomore or junior at the time of application. If the student is in a 5-year program, must be in third or fourth year at the time of application
- > Have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement (minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0)
- > Commit to a paid summer internship in the Morgan Stanley Information Technology Division in the summer following the time of application
- > Be an active member of NSBE, SHPE or SWE organizations at the time of application
- > Have demonstrated interest and aptitude in work with computers/technology
- > Computer science or engineering major is preferred, but all majors and disciplines are encouraged to apply

Richard B. Fisher Scholarship

The program is named for Richard B. Fisher, Chairman Emeritus of Morgan Stanley. Born in Philadelphia, Mr. Fisher received his bachelor's degree in history from Princeton University in 1957 and his MBA from the Harvard Graduate School of Business Administration in 1962 as a Baker Scholar with High Distinction. Mr. Fisher joined Morgan Stanley in 1962 and began his career in the corporate finance area. In 1967, he moved to the market-related side of the business and over a period of years was responsible for fixed income operations, equity and research, and then for all capital markets. He became a Managing Director and Partner of Morgan Stanley in 1970, President in 1984, and Chairman in 1991. He was named Chairman of the Executive Committee in May 1997, following the merger with Dean Witter, and Chairman Emeritus in 2000.

The Morgan Stanley Richard B. Fisher Scholars Program is a competitive scholarship program established in June 1993 to provide outstanding minority students with (i) a \$ 5,000 financial award for exceptional academic achievement, (ii) a summer internship with Morgan Stanley, (iii) a meaningful relationship with one of the premier firms in the industry. We encourage students of all majors and disciplines to apply. Morgan Stanley Information Technology Richard B. Fisher scholars are selected to work as summer analysts our Information Technology division.
