LLC750 Analyzing Discourse: Rhetoric, Genre, Narrative

This course focuses upon the close analysis of texts, both written and spoken. Using methods that will include, but not be limited to, rhetorical, genre, and narrative analysis, students will develop the means by which to explore how issues of power and ideology circulate through language. Students will have an opportunity to work on their own projects, although having a project is not necessary. The final project paper will not be due until the end of the summer.
