

## **LLC Review Special Issue**

### **Critical Perspectives on Intercultural Communication**

#### **Call for Papers**

The LLC Review, student-run journal of the Language, Literacy and Culture Doctoral program at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County, invites PhD students and postdocs to submit manuscripts for the LLC Review special issue “**Critical Perspectives on Intercultural Communication**” scheduled to be published in winter of 2010.

This special issue will focus on articles critiquing theories and methodologies of intercultural communication. Articles may concentrate on the critique of the dominant discourse in field as it has been practiced in the past by its prominent representatives (e.g., Gudykunst, Neuliep, Jandt, Ting-Toomey, Nakayama among others). In addition, authors are encouraged to suggest new approaches (“metadiscourses”) that might form the foundations for resolving the critical issues: globalization, hybridity, multiculturalism, transculturality, and/or poststructuralist discourse or cultural analysis. Contributions might also investigate the field of intercultural communication from a non-Western perspective that has received little attention by the mainstream of the discipline. Finally, the critique of the field might entail the critical study of areas neglected or peripheralized by intercultural communication theories such as media, religion, and the body. The editorial board encourages doctoral students and postdocs to submit articles (7000 words maximum) on ongoing research projects or papers on these topics.

Submission deadline for manuscripts is **September 14, 2009**.

**SUBMISSION GUIDELINES FOR LLC REVIEW SPECIAL ISSUE**  
**“Critical Perspectives on Intercultural Communication”**

1. Submissions to the *LLC Review* should conform to the requirements of the 5th edition of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (APA). Manuscripts that do not adhere to the APA style guidelines will be returned.
2. Submissions to the *LLC Review* should be accompanied by a cover page which must include:
  - a. The title of the article.
  - b. The author’s full name, e-mail address, primary phone number, and mailing address.
  - c. The word count of the manuscript, including abstract, endnotes, appendices, and references.
  - d. The author’s biography, which should not exceed 50 words.
  - e. Acknowledgements of grant support and of individuals who were of direct help in the preparations of the study, if applicable.
3. Submissions, including quotations, tables, figures, appendices, and references, must be typed in Times New Roman 12-point font, double-spaced, with one inch margins on all sides.
4. Manuscripts should be organized in the following order: the title of the article, abstract, body of the article, appendices, endnotes, and references.
5. Full-length manuscripts should include an abstract (100 words maximum) and not exceed 7000 words.
6. The name(s) of the author(s) should appear ONLY on the cover page that accompanies the manuscript, as the *LLC Review* uses a blind review process.
7. The headers or footers of the manuscript should not include any text except for page numbers.
8. All submissions must be submitted in Microsoft Word. The writing should be polished and relatively free of spelling and grammatical errors.
