
Articulation Agreement


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



AN HONORS UNIVERSITY IN MARYLAND

UMBC and Montgomery College offer an articulation agreement in conjunction with the Universities at Shady Grove that enables students to complete a Bachelor of Arts degree in Social Work with a concentration and minor in Sociology. Social Work majors with minors in Sociology have a wide range of career options available to them when they graduate. Some pursue additional educational training while others choose to enter the work force immediately. Students take their lower division courses at Montgomery College and complete their upper division courses at UMBC at the Universities at Shady Grove location in Rockville, MD. Additional time at Montgomery College and UMBC may be needed for completion of all of the requirements. The information provided below does not indicate a comprehensive listing of all degree requirements. Every student should consult an advisor every semester about appropriate course selection for meeting the following requirements.

Second Area of Concentration: **Minor in Sociology**

The minor in sociology will consist of a minimum of **18** credits. At least 6 of these credits must be taken at the upper level (300 or 400). Up to 12 credits of the minor may be completed at Montgomery College, through selection of the UMBC equivalent sociology classes. Upper level classes to fulfill the minor will be taken from among sociology course offerings at the Shady Grove Center.

No course in which a student earns a grade below "C" may count toward the minor.

Requirements

- Basic Concepts in Sociology [MC- SO 101 (3 credits); UMBC- SOC 101(3 credits)]
- 15 additional credits of sociology courses of the student's choice.
- Six or more of the credits must be at the 300 or 400 level.
- In order to receive credit for a minor, students must take at least six credits in sociology or anthropology at UMBC.
